I also had the opportunity to share my work with various non-academic experts and to visit organizations related to my field of study. This allowed me to discover similarities and differences in comparison with the Peruvian reality and thus has given me a broader perspective on matters such as the electoral systems, the organization of election processes, women's political participation and other topics of my interest.

The coordination of the Observatory on Latin America was crucial to the success of my fellowship experience. They managed to establish contact with various specialists, which I met with individually and in small seminars. The seminars, which took place prior to the public lecture, were spaces of high academic discussion related to my work. They also fostered new lines of research that have allowed me to expand my academic work.

It was attended by a large number of participants who expressed their interest (through their questions and active participation during the event) in the progress and remaining tasks concerning the inclusion of women in Peruvian politics, the topic of my research.
